Biblical Words for Time

The study of "time" by means of the Bible pages is most often confined to the search for significant differences or diverse interpretations between two Greek nouns: καιρός and χρόνος. Lexicographers and exegetes, who contend with these terms, share the conclusions that: καιρός is interpreted by them as "a point in time," "definite time," "a moment (pivotal)," "the period marked by an important event/crisis" whereas χρόνος is understood as "indefinite time during which an event occurs," "period," measurable "time lapse," "duration." These terms, being somewhat ephemeral, however evade lexical boundaries imposed on them, which is why they require to be considered within a context on a case-by-case basis. Something, that may be claimed about them with certainty, refers to their numerical quantity – καιρός is repeated 570 times in the Holy Scripture, χρόνος – "only" 194 times.
