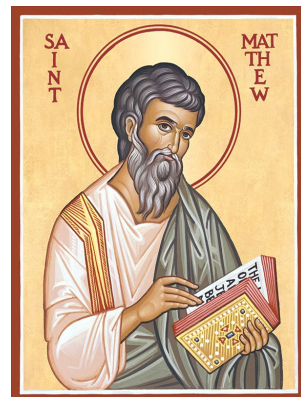

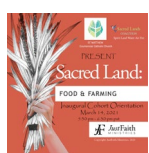
“Spring Clean Up for the Heart and Soul of Saint Matthew”

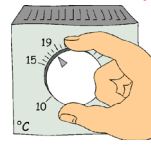


Gospel Summary

It is not clear to scholars exactly what precipitated Jesus' reaction at the Temple. In what would appear to be a fit of anger, Jesus used a whip to drive out the animals. The Jews challenged

Jesus, who replied, “Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up.” They thought Jesus was referring to the temple that had been under construction for forty years, but Jesus was speaking of the resurrection of the temple of his body—a temple they did not recognize. –RCLB

St. Matthew's Social Justice and Outreach ministry collects food and toiletry donations weekly at the 9:30am and 12:30am masses.

Donations needed include healthy canned and dried food, toiletries, sanitizing and cleaning supplies, diapers (adult and children) and baby wipes. Donations can be left at the church door closest to the outdoor-mass tent. This collection supports working-poor families of our community and is distributed by Western Service Workers Association of Santa Ana.

Western Service Workers Association needs volunteers with cars to help pick up and distribute food donations to hungry people in need who don't drive. Days/times they need help with include Fridays at around 10:30 a.m. and Sunday mornings to pick up perishable food (no later than 10:30 or 11) and other volunteers to deliver food to hungry folks in the community Sundays 12-3 pm. Even if people can volunteer once in a while, not necessarily every Sunday, that is helpful. Distribution is done in a no-contact manner. If you can help, please contact WSWA at 714-835-9961.
